\$1 Billion Family Home : the Antilia House-Ambani...

MOST EXPENSIVE HOUSE IN THE WORL

Mukesh Ambani's \$1 billion home is located in Mumbai, India and is called the Antilia house.



Antilia is named after the mythical island in the Atlantic. The construction is inspired by the Hanging Gardens of Babylon



The \$1 billion family home built for the world's fourth richest man Mukesh Ambani, his wife and three children, is said to include 27 buildings. Ambani family has employed a staff of 600 to tend to the home.



According to Inhabitat the Antilia is "boasting 27 stories at 568 feet high, with a total area of over 398,000 square feet of building, which has taken nearly three years to complete, hosts 27-stories, which are far from modest.



Antilla, has consumed electricity worth Rs. 70,69,488 in the one month since Mukesh Ambani moved in with wife Nita and is the Mumbai's highest residential electricity bill generated till date.



The home contains a health club with a gym and dance studio, a swimming pool, a ballroom, guestrooms, a variety of lounge cinema. Three helicopter pads have been installed on the roof, and a car park for 160 vehicles sits on the ground floor.

Each floor are designed with various materials so as to bring a different look



Lounges, fine rugs, chandeliers and mirrors can be seen at any room.



The most striking features of the Antilla which caught my eye is probably the ballroom which has crystal chandeliers that 80% of the ceiling.



It has silver stairways that lead to a central landing, behind which two retractable doors can open to display works of art.

There is also a stage for entertainment or speeches, with a projection screen behind it.

A kitchen, about the same size as the ballroom itself, can service hundreds of guests, an Olympic-size swimming pool and a garden.



Other floors have gyms and glass-fronted apartments for guests.



The two floors above the family's residence have been set aside as maintenance areas and for an "air space floor" capable of holding three helicopters.
